He was placed in charge of the communications, which the Boers were constantly attempting to cut. General Kelly Kenny remained in charge, with an oversight over all the operations in the Free State, until he came home to England in 1901.

Other important duties remained for the great leader here. He was Adjutant-General of the Forces until 1904; and he retired in 1907 with fifty years' service to his credit General Kelly-Kenny enjoyed the confidence and Hiendship of King Edward VII, and was selected by his Majesty to accompany Prince Arthur of

Connaught on his mission to Japan in 1906.
General Kelly-Kenny was a bluff and hearty Irishman, with the traditional humour of his race. He was awarded many distinguished orders including G.C.B. and the G.C.V.O.
