## MARKING OF SALMON IN IRELAND.

Several Irish newspapers have given publicity lately to a circular relating to salmon marking operations carried out in England and Wales under the auspices of the Board of Agriculture Fisheries. The Department of Agriculture Technical Instruction for Ireland desire to point out that for many years similar work has been carried on in this country by the Fisheries Branch of the Department and to state that marked salmon taken off the Irish coast and in Irish rivers will be found to most probably the labels of the Irish Department. These labels are small discs or pieces of silver, usually oxidized, fastened to the top of the back fin or to the "Dead" fin. The Department are prepared to pay a reward of 2s. 6d. for the return of each such label, if accompanied by particulars of date and place of capture and length and weight of the fish, and, when convenient, a few scales from the side of the fish, labels, etc., and any communications relating to salmon marking in Ireland should be addressed to the Secretary, Department of Agriculture and Technical Instruction for Ireland, Fisheries Branch, 2 Kildare Place, Dublin. The postage on such communications need not be prepaid.
