

DEATH OF LORD JUSTICE MORIARTY.

The death occurred at Birmingham at 9 o'clock on Sunday morning of Lord Justice Moriarty, who, some days ago, became seriously ill at Droitwich, and underwent an operation. From the first little hope was entertained of his recovery.

The Right Hon John Francis Moriarty was the son of Mr John Moriarty, a solicitor, who had a good practice at Mallow. He was educated at Stonyhurst and Trinity College, Dublin, of which he was a distinguished graduate. Called to the Bar in 1877, his forensic ability soon gained for him a lucrative practice, and he was engaged in most of the important cases of his time. He took silk in 1904, but for some years interests other than his profession engaged his attention, and for a time he resided in the United States. On his return to Ireland, says the "Irish Times," he resumed his practice at the Bar, and in a short time he became one of the leaders amongst the Inner Bar in Ireland. He was elected a Benchet in 1908, and in the same year was created a Serjeant-at-Law, which rank he held for five years. In April, 1913, he was appointed Solicitor-General for Ireland, and in June of the same year he was promoted to the office of Attorney-General. In 1914 he was appointed Lord Justice of Appeal in succession to Lord Justice Cherry, when he was promoted from the Court of Appeal to the Chief Justiceship of the King's Bench Division. Lord Justice Moriarty was a man of learning and culture, whilst his accurate and intimate knowledge of men and public affairs was of the greatest possible assistance to him, both as a lawyer and a judge. Though he could be biting sarcasm when occasion required, he had a very kindly disposition, was a sincere friend, and would suffer much personal inconvenience to do an act of benevolence or charity. During recent years he did not take any active interest in politics, but in the early 'eighties he contested Mallow, his native town, for a seat in Parliament his opponent being Mr William O'Brien, who defeated him. During his occupancy of the Bench he proved himself to be a capable and painstaking judge, and his judgments were invariably accepted as being equitably as well as sound in law. At the recent Assizes Lord Justice Moriarty gave valuable assistance, to recruiting by calling attention to the statistics for the several counties in which he sat.

Up to some years ago the late Lord Justice was a familiar figure as one of the leading Counsel on the Munster Circuit, and figured in many important cases heard at Limerick Assizes. The news of his demise has been heard of with much regret in the city as elsewhere.
