DEATH OF MR MARTIN LEAHY, J.P.

We regret to announce the death of Mr Martin Leahy, J.P., which occurred at his residence 42 Scot Terrace at an early hour this morning. The sad event was not unexpected, the deceased having been in failing health for some six months past. The late Mr Leahy was a familiar and a very popular personality in the city. His name was closely identified with Trades Union work, and for some time he was President of the local Trades' Council. Since the passing of the Local Government Act he took an active part in civic affairs, having been for some thirteen years up to the last triennial elections a Councillor for the Shannon Ward in the Borough Council, and his broad views and sound judgment were always appreciated by his fellow members. He was also a member of the Technical Education Committee, which he represented at Congresses held in various parts of the country, as also those of the Trades' Council. He was an old member of the Catholic Institute and of its Cricket Club, in which pastime he was on many an occasion conspicuous by his superior batting. Some seven years ago he was appointed to the Commission of the Peace for the City, was a frequent attendant on the bench, and his decisions were ever characterised by justice and mercy. Mr Leahy was also largely connected with business pursuits, and both in commercial and private life his genial nature and unvarying courtesy won for him the esteem of all with whom he came in contact. His demise in the prime of life is deeply regretted by a wide circle of friends, who sincerely sympathise with his widow in her grief.
