**LIMERICK UNION.**

**Soap Required.**

THE Board of Guardians of this Union will, at their meeting on WEDNESDAY, 1st DECEMBER, 1915, be prepared to receive tenders for supplying the Workhouse with the following article to the 30th September, 1916, viz—Best Irish-made Soap, at per ton. After the contractor shall have been declared, the Board to be at liberty to order at one time six months' supply, which must be delivered at the Workhouse within one month after acceptance, subject, however, to this provision, that the Guardians shall submit to analysis any portion or portions of the soap so delivered, and if it shall be found not equal in every respect to the sample the contract will be rescinded, and the soap so delivered must be taken away by the contractor without any expense to the Guardians. Tenders, accompanied with samples of soap, and containing the names of two solvent sureties for the due performance of the contract, to be sent by post, addressed to the Presiding Chairman, so as to reach the workhouse on or before 12 o'clock noon on above-named day, marked on the outside "Soap." A deposit of £3 must be lodged in Clerk's office, which shall be returned on completion of bond within seven days from acceptance of tender. The lowest or any tender need not be accepted.—By order,
