A letter was read from the Local Government Board pointing out that the arrears in the collection of rents to labourers cottages up to December amounted to £419 1s 9d, which they regarded as unsatisfactory, and suggested that the collectors should use every effort to have it reduced within the half year.

The letter was ordered to be referred to the collectors.

The Council then adjourned.

INFANT'S BODY FOUND.

Mr J. F. Barry, J.P., City Coroner, held an inquest to-day at the City Courthouse as to the death of a male infant, the body of which was discovered close to the bed of the Abbey River yesterday afternoon. It was seen on the margin of the river by a man named John Walsh who was passing up the Salmon Weir Bank, and who noticed its feet protruding under a piece of blanket with which the body was covered. Dr Mulcahy stated that the infant was probably born alive, and that death was due rather to neglect at the time of birth and to exposure, than to drowning. Constable Connell said the body must have been washed by the tide to the place where it was discovered. District Inspector Craig, who conducted the enquiry, said he was there last evening, and observed that where the infant was first seen, was under water. The jury found in accordance with the medical testimony.

DEFENCE OF REALM ACT.

It is alleged that Mr McDonagh was the leader of a large crowd of Sinn Feiners who attempted to walk through a recruiting meeting at Moyullen last Friday. The arrest has caused much excitement in the district.
