It may be possible for me to appoint receiving agents at the railway station in the market towns of outlying districts which are too remote from Adare for direct carting. Notice of any such appointments will be advertised in the columns of this paper.

I may mention that the report which I have received of samples submitted to the trade lead me to state that I should be in a position to continue purchasing scotch grass even after the war is ended, and thus establish a permanent industry, which previous to the war was entirely controlled by Austria and Germany.

I am not yet in a position to offer definite prices for other herb, except dandelion roots which have been carefully washed and topped. For this herb, however, I can offer from 8s to 10s per cwt for an unlimited quantity of these according to quality.—Yours faithfully,
