MEDICAL OFFICERSHIP TRANSFER.

Mr Sheehan proposed, in pursuance of notice of motion, that Dr P F Graham be transferred to the nearby medical officership of Limerick No. 3 District, rendered vacant by the resignation of Dr Shanahan. He said Dr Graham, by virtue of seniority, was entitled to the transfer. Arrangement had been come to by the medical men some years ago on the question, and it was agreed by the Board of Guardians, but unless wanted to treat the resolution as a scrap of paper to be torn they should accede to Dr Graham's request.

Mr P Bourke, in seconding the motion, observed that Dr Graham's claim was deserving of recognition of the Guardians. By transferring him to No. 3 District, he would gain nothing in the standpoint of a monetary advantage, but his duties less irksome, inasmuch as his present district included several tenements, and was not physically able to endure the hardships incident on the office.

Mr N. Humphreys supported the resolution, remarked that he would have voted for the transfer the last day it was before the Board, had known the circumstances.

The Chairman—I think the Board ought to be unanimous in this matter.

Mr G Frost—Yes.

Mr McGrath proposed, and Mr T Humphreys seconded, that no transfer take place, and that the terms of the advertisement be adhered to—namely, that the election take place for a medical officer for No. 3 Urban Dispensary Area.

Mr Frost—Give the transfer, and proceed with election for a medical officer for No 2 Urban District afterwards.

The Chairman—No; I have an amendment now and I will take a vote on it.
