LIMERICK CHAPLAIN'S DEATH

In Mesopotamia.

His many friends in Limerick City and County will learn with sincere regret of the death of Rev J Austin Hartigan, S.J., Tarbrook, Croom, which took place at Amara, Mesopotamia, on the 16th instant. The gallant clergyman, who was only in his thirty-second year, volunteered for service early this year with the troops, and in May last he was sent to Mesopotamia with his battalion, the Connaught Rangers. He was fourth son of the late Dr J T Hartigan, Tarbrook, and had a distinguished collegiate course. There are three brothers of the deceased gentlemen—Dr T J Hartigan, Mr P Hartigan, and Mr M Hartigan serving with the Colours at the present time. Yesterday morning the following wire was sent to his mother, Mrs Hartigan, Tarbrook, Croom, from the Secretary of State for War—"Deeply regret to inform you that the Rev J A Hartigan died of wounds at No 1 British General Hospital, Amara on July 16th. The Army Council express their sympathy. This would have been notified before, but no next-of-kin was registered."
