## LIMERICK COUNTY COUNCIL.

## Appointment of Poor Rate Collector.

NOTICE is hereby given that the Council for the Administrative County of Limerick will, at their meeting to be held in the Council Chamber, Limerick, on Saturday, the 2nd day of September, 1916, at the hour of 11 o'clock a.m., proceed to elect a Poor Rate Collector for the Limerick No. 3 Collection District, comprising the electoral divisions of Abington, Ballyvarra, Clonkeen, and Glenstal. The person appointed will receive as remuneration for his services—provided the duties are satisfactorily discharged—poundage fees at the rate of 6d in the £ on the amount of the warrant, which must be lodged by him in full within the financial half-years ending 30th September and 31st March. The person appointed will also receive the customary fees under the Franchise and Juries Acts, but same shall be subject to such variation as legislation necessitated by the war shall entail, and in addition a sum of £10 per annum to cover cost of stationery, postage, etc.

The person appointed will be required to discharge, to the satisfaction of the County Council, the duties of the office of Collector of Poor Rates as defined by the Public Bodies Order, 1904 (Articles 82 to 102), and must be prepared to perform all duties the Council have determined as necessary under existing Acts and Orders, and such other duties as the Council may from time to time direct, without increased remuneration, unless the Council otherwise determine.

The person appointed will further be required to give a bond to the County Council with two sufficient sureties, or with an approved Guaranteed Society, conditioned in a penalty of £1,000 for the due performance of the duties of the office, and the bond so entered into shall be in accordance with the form prescribed by the Public Bodies Order, 1904, Article 87 (Form 55 or 57, as the case may be).

Applications for the appointment will be received by me up to 4 o'clock, p.m., on Friday, the 1st day of September, 1916, and must state the names of the sureties proposed to be given, and must be accompanied by a certificate of birth.

Candidates must be over 21 years of age.
