The deceased gentleman, who was in his 76th year, was High Sheriff of Clare in 1890, and was formerly an ex-officio guardian of the Limerick Union. His kindly and courteous manner made him very popular with the residents of Castleconnell and Doonass, where his death is deeply mourned, and general sympathy is expressed with Mrs Vincent and family in their keen sorrow. The funeral will take place on Wednesday at 11.30 a.m. for Clonlara. The late Colonel Vincent has three sons in the army, Lieut-Col Berkeley Vincent, and Lieut Patrick Vincent, who are at the front, and Lieut Arthur Vincent.
