APPEAL DISMISSED.

London, Wednesday.
Court of Appeal to-day, Lords Justices Eady and Bankes, and Mr Justice A T Lawrence, dismissed the appeal of Messrs A Coker and Co., Ltd., of Castle-street, Liverpool, in the action against the Limerick Steamship Co., Ltd., against Coker. In the action the plaintiffs claimed damages equivalent to freight in respect of chartering of their steamer Coonagh by defendants. Defendants counter-claimed for £10,000, which they had paid. Plaintiffs said the money was not repaid as it was paid in respect of advance freight. Defendants contended that it ought to be repaid as it was merely to be regarded in the nature of a loan. Mr Justice Baillache, who presided, decided in favour of the plaintiffs, and allowed the claim and counter-claim, and the appeal against that judgment. Lordships to-day dismissed the appeal, and allowed the judgment of the court below, except in so far as it would be slightly varied. The sum of £10,000 in the judgment was entered would be reduced.
