RAILWAY TRAFFIC.

Notice to Traders.

The Railway Executive Committee announce that as from Tuesday, January 2nd, all open goods and coal waggons suitable for general purposes belonging to railway companies under Government control may be loaded with merchandise consigned to any station on or beyond the line of any of the controlled companies, irrespec- tive of the ownership of such waggons and of the routes by which they were received either full or empty. It is urged upon traders that in the national interest it is of the highest importance that all waggons should be liberated and placed for further service with the utmost expedition, as to allow the waggons to remain under load is to enhance the difficulties under which the transport is being carried on with prejudicial effect to the movement of urgent munitions and Government stores essential to the conduct of the war.

DEATH OF REV J GORMAN, P.P. MANISTER.

We regret to record the death of Rev Father Gorman, P.P., which took place at the residence of his sister, Mrs O'Sullivan, Churchtown. The deceased clergyman was just in the prime of his life, and was a native of Newcastle West.
