### SERIOUS ACCIDENT AVERTED.

A few days ago a serious, if not fatal accident was averted through the prompt action taken by a witness of the occurrence. A man named O'Loghlen was engaged cleaning windows on the third storey of a large establishment in George-street, when the guard gave way, and to prevent his falling from such a height he fortunately was able to catch with one hand the bar on a level with the sill. Mr M O'Sullivan, County Council Officer, who was passing into the establishment, saw O'Loghlen's perilous position, and promptly rushed upstairs with another man, Mr F Guinane, who assisted, both arriving in good time to the rescue. But for their intervention so speedily O'Loghlen would in all probability have been fatally injured by the fall which he narrowly escaped. They certainly deserve great credit for their timely aid over the accident.

### DEATH OF MR FRANCIS MCCARNEY.

Much regret is felt at the death of Mr Francis McCarney, which took place on Saturday last at his residence, Athlunkard-street. Deceased had been ill for only a short time, and his death was not altogether expected, the esteem in which the late Mr McCarney was held, and the sympathy felt for his family in their bereavement, were evidenced by the large number of people who attended his funeral last Monday from St Mary's Parish Church, the interment taking place at Mount St Laurence Cemetery.
