Above the line of battle there drifted towards us a column of smoke and the Irish disappeared over the top of the parapet. Then began a backward stream of the enemy. At first it was not clear who was leading. Later we realised the Irish had the position that had defied so many previous attacks and the little groups were German machine guns sent down to the cages."
