DEATH OF SERGEANT MAUNSELL, R.M.F.

Many friends in Limerick have heard with
regret of the death, which has occurred at the
military barracks, Aghada, of Sergeant W.
Maunsell, 3rd Batt. Royal Munster Fusiliers.
Deceased had been many years in the R.I.C., at-
taining to the rank of sergeant, and retiring from
the service some years ago, he volunteered for the
Army some time after the outbreak of war.
He had been at the front for a considerable time,
and was twice wounded. He died of syncope on
the 16th instant at Aghada, where he had been
for some months. The interment with military
honours took place at the military cemetery,
Fort Carlisle, and was attended by relatives and
other mourners.
