INQUEST.

Mr J F Barry, J.P., City Coroner, held an in-
quest to-day as to the death of Michael Hannan,
27, a shop-porter, who was discovered dead, with
head downward, in an oatbin in an establishment
at Robert Street where he was employed. It was
stated in evidence that Hannan had been subject
to epileptic fits, and that he was apparently
attacked when he went into a stable in rear of the
premises between ten and eleven o'clock last
night. Doctor Graham deposed that death was
due to suffocation while deceased was attacked
with an epileptic fit, and the jury found accord-
ingly.
