

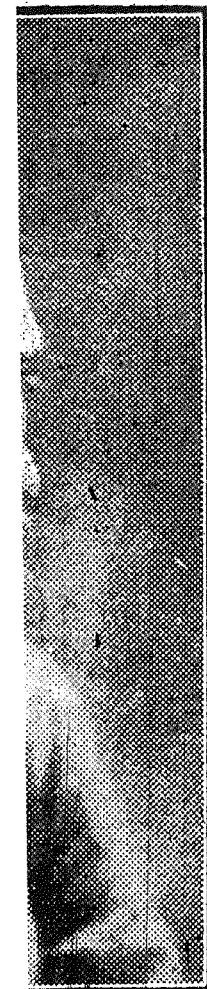

FUNERAL OF MR THOMAS O'GRADY. ADARE.

The funeral of the late Mr Thomas O'Grady, Stationmaster, Adare, who passed away on the 6th instant, at the early age of 40 years, took place on Sunday last at two o'clock for the family burial place at Askeaton. The father of the deceased had been stationmaster in that village for a number of years, and he himself filled a similar position there, as well as at Farranaleen (Co Tipperary), Kilmacow (Co Kilkenny), Ballycumber, King's County, and finally at Adare, where he had been some three years. A most courteous and efficient officer, he was held in high esteem by the Railway Company which he had so faithfully served for a period of twenty-seven years, while with the public he was very popular with all classes and creeds. This was fully demonstrated by the very large attendance from Adare and surrounding districts, the cortege being over a mile in length, and the deep sympathy which is expressed with his widow and young family in their irreparable loss. It would be impossible to give a full list of those present.
