DEFINITION OF MOTOR CAR.

The expression "Motor Car" means a carriag propelled by Mechanical Power, and includes Motor bicycle and a Motor tricycle, but doe not include a vehicle drawn by a Moto Car.

These duties do not apply to any Motor Car Motor Omnibus or other Venicle, being a hackness carriage within the meaning of Section 4 of the Customs and Inland Revenue Act, 1888, nor to

Every person liable to the payment of any of the above Duties is required by the Acts to fill up and sign a Declaration which is to be delivered to the proper Officer before the expiration of the Month of January or before the expiration of twenty one days from the date when such persons hall first incur liability. The Penalty, for not delivering a Declaration or for making an untrue Declaration is £20.

A Penalty of £20 (over and above the Duty) is also incurred by every person keeping a Motor Car without having "aken out the Licence required by Law.

Forms of declaration may be obtained at any Money Order Office in Ireland. In order, however, that the proceeds of Motor Licences may to the credit of the County of Limerick, it is necessary that application for a Licence should be made to the Kilmaallock Post Office (not to the G.P.O., Limerick), as Kilmallock is the only Office authorised to issue Licences for the County of Limerick.
