CONTROL OF TIMBER.

TO THE EDITOR OF THE LIMERICK CHRONICLE.
 DEAR SIR—Arising out of the control of timber
 sales by the Government, I see in a trade paper
 that the Government has arranged with the
 Chambers of Commerce in Belfast, Dublin, and
 Cork to appoint Advisory Committees to
 scrutinise all applications to purchase wood for
 industrial purposes in Ireland. The Dublin
 Chamber gets charge of Leinster and
 Connaught, Belfast Chamber of Ulster,
 and Cork Chamber of Munster. This means
 that even the largest builder or other
 consumer in Limerick must apply to Cork for per-
 mission to purchase any imported soft wood, while
 a consumer in, say Mayo or Sligo, districts
 naturally served by Limerick in the ordinary
 course of trade, have to apply to Dublin. This
 arrangement ignores Limerick's important Chamber
 of Commerce, and except we are willing to have
 our city pushed aside altogether I think a local
 demand should be made to have a Timber Advisory
 Committee appointed in Limerick as well as in the
 other three ports.—Yours truly,
