**CANADA'S TIMBER RESOURCES.**

Canada possesses the largest forests in the British Empire. This fact emphasizes Canada's strategic position. What part Canada's forests will play in British trade after the war is problematical, but there is no lack of evidence to show that every square mile of growing timber will double its value under the strain of post-bellum demand from the devastated districts of Europe. Meanwhile, those responsible in Canada are taking full advantage of increasing timber value by thorough fire protection and scientific control of wasteful lumbering.

**THE DOG TAX IN IRELAND.**

The Executive Committee of the Irish Game Protection Association met yesterday at their offices in Dublin. Mr. Edward White, president. The Committee, in furtherance of their advocacy of the increase of the dog tax in Ireland to 7s 6d, as in Great Britain, decided to have the matter raised in both Houses of Parliament this session.

**IRISH FOOD QUESTIONS.**

It is probable that a campaign to urge the wider adoption of compulsory rationing in Ireland will be adopted at no distant date. Already quite a number of persons systematically restrict the amount of food they consume, but it is doubtful what proportion of the population they represent. The Food Control Committee, it is understood, would welcome efforts to extend voluntary rationing, though their hands are too full to take charge of any campaign to attain that object. A matter to which the Committee attach considerable importance is the use of potatoes in bread-making, and for that reason steps are being taken to adapt a number of mills in Ireland to the preparation of potatoes for that purpose. The use of potatoes in bread-making is not yet compulsory, even in England, but local food authorities there have taken in hand the provision of potatoes for bakers.

**SUPPLIES OF OATS FOR SEEDS.**

The Department draw attention in our advertising columns to-day to the fact that the prices for oats set out in the Grain Prices Order, 1917, do not apply to oats sold or used specifically for seed purposes. It is also pointed out that in view of the threatened shortage of feeding stuffs there will be greater need than ever for an increase in the area under oats in Ireland, and that farmers should reserve their best samples of oats for the purpose of ensuring seed for the increased area which it is expected they will place under this crop in 1918.

**CO. LIMERICK FATAL ACCIDENT.**

An accident, the victim of which was a man named Thomas Casey, seemingly a woodman, which occurred at Kilmone, had fatal results at the North Infirmary, Cork, yesterday evening. The deceased man was cutting down a tree, and when the tree fell he was struck by the butt, three or four of his ribs being broken and his arm sustaining a compound fracture. He was conveyed to the North Infirmary, but died two hours after admission. He was aged about 43 years.
