**COUNTY LIMERICK ESTATE.**

(Before Mr Justice Meredith.)

In the matter of the estate of William Baggott (deceased), Baggott and others v. Ellen and Matthew Kennedy, an application was made on behalf of the plaintiffs, who are minors, suing by their next friend, Mary Heelan, their maternal aunt, that an order for the carriage of the sale of the lands of Friarstown, Grange, Co. Limerick, be transferred from the defendant, Ellen Kennedy, to the plaintiffs.

It appeared that James Baggott, one of the plaintiffs, had now attained the age of 21.

Wm. Baggott died on 22nd September, 1916, leaving surviving him the defendant, Ellen, who subsequently married Matthew Kennedy. The present applicant was one of four children of Wm. Baggott. Both plaintiffs and defendant reside on the lands of Friarstown. On 26th July, 1932, an order was made directing the defendants to lodge in Court £387 3s 5d, balance of the estate found to be due from her before 18th Oct., 1932. The order for sale of the lands was made at the same time. The money was not lodged, and no steps taken for the sale.

It was pointed out for the defendant that the money could be taken out of her distributive share of the estate, and that she had made no delay in the sale of the lands, the proper period for such transactions being the period March to July.

His Lordship adjourned the matter until the first Monday in March.
