**MOTOR-CARS KEPT BY HND FOR THE PURPOSE OF THEM Motor Bicycles or Triocycles Other Motor-Cars:—**  
Not exceeding 6½ horse power  
Exceeding 6½ but not exceeding 12 horse power  
Exceeding 12 but not exceeding 16 horse power  
Exceeding 16 but not exceeding 26 horse power  
Exceeding 26 but not exceeding 33 horse power  
Exceeding 33 but not exceeding 40 horse power

### DEFINITION OF

The expression "Motor Cycle" propelled by Mechanical Power not include a vehicle drawn by Motor Omnibus or other Vehicle carriage within the meaning of the Customs and Inland Revenue Act, 1904.  
Every person liable to the above Duties is required to sign a Declaration when the proper Officer before the Month of January or before twenty-one days from the date of first incur liability, delivering a Declaration of Declaration is £20.

A Penalty of £20 (over and above) also incurred by every Motor Car without having taken the same by Law.

Forms of declaration may be obtained from the Money Order Office in Limerick, or from any of the County Council Offices in Limerick, or from the necessary that application be made to the Kilmallock, G.P.O., Limerick, as authorized to issue Licences in Limerick.
