LORD CAMPBELL'S ACT.

Mr Justice Moore, in the King's Bench Division 63 Tussday, made a rule of Court the order of the House of Lords in the case of John Maskey v. James Henry Monks (Preston), Ltd, under Lord Campbell's Act to recover damages for the death of paintiff's son, accidentally killed while working in connection with defendants' ship at Waterford. The Assize jury awarded £250, but the King's Bench dismissed the action on the motion for judgment, and the Lords reversed the decisions both of the Court of Appeal and the King's Bench. Mr. Moloney (instructed by Mr Donnelly, Treasury solicitor) made the application.

GAS COMPANIES AND THE WAR.
