It is officially announced that during an attack he led a flanking party which rushed an enemy "pillar-box." He personally shot eight of the defenders, and succeeded in cutting off a party of the enemy who were retreating. The success of the enterprise was largely due to him. This gallant soldier was through the South African War, where he won two medals. He subsequently joined the United States Army, and served in Mexico during the troubles there. Later on he volunteered in Canada for the present war.
