D.C.M for Kilrush Man.

Sergeant J Slattery, of the Canadian forces, son

 been awarded the D.C.M. It is officially an-
 nounced that during an attack he led a flanking
 party which rushed an enemy "pillar-box." He
 personally shot eight of the defenders, and suc-
 ceeded in cutting off a party of the enemy who
 were retreating. The success of the enterprise
 was largely due to him. This gallant soldier was
 through the South African War, where he won
 two medals. He subsequently joined the United
 States Army, and served in Mexico during the
 troubles there. Later on he volunteered in
 Canada for the present war.

NEWCASTLE WEST MAN KILLED IN ACTION.

Corporal E Kelly, Irish Guards, son of the late
 Mr John Kelly, Newcastle West, has been killed
 in action in France. The intelligence of his death
 was received by his relatives a few days ago from
 the War Office, and has caused general regret in
 his native place. He was through some of the
 fiercest engagements of the war, and in October
 last received the Military Medal for conspicuous
 gallantry. At the meeting of the Limerick Young
 Ireland Branch, U.I.L. a vote of condolence was
 tendered to his brother, Mr P Kelly, in his
 bereavement.
