REVISED RETAIL JAM PRICES

By the Jam (Prices) Order No 2, 1918, which came into operation yesterday, the Food Controller has amended the maximum prices for jams made with the new season's soft fruits, the retail prices being as follows:—Strawberry, where the container holds 1lb, 1s 2d; 2lbs, 2s 2½d; 3lbs, 3s 4d; 7lbs, 7s 8d. The respective prices for the undermentioned varieties are:—Black currant, loganberry, and raspberry, 1s 1½d, 2s 1d, 3s 1d, 7s 2½d; red currant, raspberry, and red currant, 1s 0½d, 1s 1½d, 2s 10d, and 6s 7½d; raspberry and gooseberry, and strawberry and gooseberry, 1s, 1s 10½d, 2s 10d, 6s 6½d; gooseberry, gooseberry and red currant, 11½d, 1s 10d, 2s 8½d, 6s 3½d; black currant and apple, raspberry and apple, raspberry and plum, strawberry and apple, rhubarb and raspberry, rhubarb and strawberry, 11d, 1s 9d, 2s 7d, 6s 0½d; rhubarb and apple, rhubarb and ginger, rhubarb and lemon, rhubarb and gooseberry, rhubarb, 11d, 4s 8½d, 2s 8½d, 6s 9½d. The prices for other other varieties remain the same as hitherto. The additional charge of 3d per lb for jelly is no longer permitted.
