MINISTRY OF FOOD.

DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE AND TECHNICAL INSTRUCTION FOR IRELAND.
(FOOD CONTROL SECTION.)

The Manufacture of Flour and Bread Order, 1918.

BY directions issued on the 28th May, 1920, the Food Controller prohibited the retail sale of Imported Flour or the use of Imported Flour for any purpose except when mixed with flour milled and mixed in the United Kingdom in accordance with the Orders and Directions of the Food Controller relating to the milling and mixing of wheaten flour. By these directions the Food Controller also ordered that in Ireland the proportion of Imported Flour in the mixture shall not exceed 20 per cent.

The attention of the Food Controller has been drawn to cases in which bakers, despite these directions, are selling by retail pure Imported Flour which has been allocated to them for use in the manufacture of bread.

Notice is hereby given that any trader infringing these directions after this date will receive no further supplies of Imported Flour.
