At Valenciennes we cleared the enemy from the Forest de Raismes, and captured the village of Thiers, Haute Rive, and Thun.

FRENCH GAINS EXTENDED.

(FRENCH COMMUNIQUE.)

Paris, Thursday.

Afternoon's communiqué says:—
At the Oise front our troops crossed the Canal Grand Verly. In spite of enemy counter-attacks we maintained ourselves on our bank. Between the Oise and the Serre the struggle was lively. In the region of the railway line, of Mesrecourt, we have made some gains. North of Nizy Le Comte we appreciated our gains. During the night on the east of Voiziers there was great activity on the part of the opposing artillery.
