It is to be hoped that early in the new Parljament this information will be forthcoming We see that at the annual general meeting of the Dublin Chamber of Commerce, to be held next Tuesday, a motion is to be proposed calling attention to the urgent needs for a comprehensive scheme of housing reform in the Metropolis. and asking the Covernment and the Treasury to grant the nicessary lineacial aid for the carrying out of the scheme. In Limerick, too, every affort is being made to complete a scheme worthy of the city. We trust the operation of the project will not be long delayed by the Hevermaent.
