Authorities Active.

OFFICIAL PROCLAMATION

Funeral of Mr. Byrne.

Activities in police and military circles were continued in the city and district yesterday in connection with the affair at Limerick Workhouse on Sunday afternoon when Constable Martin O'Brien was shot dead, and Mr Robert J. Byrne, a prisoner patient, subsequently succumbed to wounds.

Limerick and Military Area.

Mr Davies, Assistant Inspector-General of the Royal Irish Constabulary, with Captain R J Russell, Chief Intelligence Officer, Southern District, and other military officers, were in the city on Tuesday evening in view of the proclamation to be issued making Limerick a military area.

Official Warning

The following official communique was yesterday issued for publication by the Irish Press Censor regarding the funeral of Mr R J Byrne at Limerick to-day: "The Government have no wish to interfere with the solemnity and dignity of any funeral ceremony, but they cannot tolerate any defiance of the law."

THE LATE MR R J BYRNE.

On Tuesday night the remains of Mr Robert J Byrne were removed from the house of Mr John Ryan, 10, Rockingham-street, and were interred in St John's Cathedral at 8 o'clock, and all along the route to St John's Cathedral the cortege, which was of extensive proportions, was witnessed by large numbers of people.

THE FUNERAL

Immense Attendance.

The funeral of Mr Robert J Byrne took place this morning at 10 o'clock in St John's Cathedral, and was attended by an immense number of people, many of whom were in uniform.
