#### FORTHCOMING CONFERENCE IN DUBLIN.

A letter was read from the office of the Irish County Councils' General Council, stating that a conference of Council delegates was to be held in Dublin on Tuesday next, 20th instant, to consider, among other matters, the deficiency in the capitation grant and the scale of wages and hours of Irish asylum staffs. The Committee were asked to send a delegation to the conference—the Resident Medical Superintendent and three members. The Committee unanimously appointed Canon Driscoll, Alderman McNeice, and the Chairman, with Dr Irwin, to attend the conference.

The Chairman remarked that the question of the capitation grant was an important one. The Committee had been harping at it for the last eight years.

#### TRADESMEN'S WAGES.

Arising out of a notice of motion, it was stated that the rate of remuneration of Mr Lee, engineer, was at the standard rate, and by resolution of the Board could not be exceeded.

The wages of the upholsterer was fixed at the standard rate, and other applications as to standard wages dealt with by the Committee.

#### MEAT CONTRACT.

Mr C Sheahan, Roche's Street, was declared contractor for the supply of beef and mutton at £7.50 per cwt.

The routine business was disposed of, and the meeting adjourned.
