

Registrar-General's Report.

The births and deaths registered in the Dublin Registration Area and in the eighteen principal Provincial Urban Districts of Ireland, with the annual rates per 1,000 of the population represented thereby, which for the purposes of these returns, is estimated at 1,142,268, are given in Table II of the Registrar-General's report for week-ending Saturday, June 14th. The births are represented by 24.1 in the Dublin Registration Area; Belfast, 23.7; Cork, 19.7; Londonderry, 40.7; Limerick, 23.0; Waterford, 7.6. The deaths from all causes appertaining to the undermentioned areas for last week and for the past four weeks, respectively, were equal to the following annual rates per 1,000 of the population:—Nineteen Town Districts, 13.9 and 14.7; Dublin Registration Area, 13.4 and 15.0; Dublin City, 13.8 and 16.0; Belfast, 13.5 and 13.5; Cork, 12.9 and 12.1; Londonderry, 15.3 and 19.4; Limerick, 12.2 and 19.3; and Waterford, 28.5 and 18.5. The deaths from certain epidemic diseases registered in the 19 town districts during last week were equal to an annual rate of 0.3 per 1,000. The 104 deaths from all causes for Belfast include three from diarrhoea. Among the 6 deaths from all causes for Galway is one from enteric fever, and of the 7 deaths from all cause for Kilkenny one is from whooping-cough.

SAD FATALITY AT ADARE.

The sympathy of the citizens will be extended to Mr and Mrs J E Galbraith, Barrington-street, on the death of their son, Eddie, which occurred under tragic circumstances yesterday evening. The little lad, who was two years of age, was staying with his grandmother, Mrs Walshe, at Tuogh, Adare, and yesterday his father went to take him back to the city. Mr Galbraith had only arrived twenty minutes or so at the residence of his mother-in-law when the fatality took place. While the cows were being milked the little fellow ran out of the house and while watching the milking he received a kick from a cow, which terminated fatally. The funeral will take place from Tuogh for Adare at 2 p.m. to-morrow.

DROWNING FATALITY AT KILLALOE.

The body of Patrick Hinchey, an ex-Army man, who was drowned in the Shannon at Killaloe, has been recovered a couple of hundred yards below the point at which he went into the water. It appears that his cap fell into the river, and having recovered it, he said, "As I am wet, I will have a good swim," at the same time jumping into the water, which was very high at the time. The presumption is that he must have been dashed against a rock and rendered unconscious, as he was a capital swimmer. He saw service in South Africa, and also in France and Flanders.
