Several Shipwreeks in Baltic and North Sea.

The recent heavy gale in the Baltic and North Ses has caused several shipwrecks. The big Swedish Lloyd Company's steamer Campania, 1,554 tons, has been aground on a reef off Stock. holm since Tuesday. Other steamers have sunk, but the crews were saved, except a ship's cook on a Swedish schooner, who was frozen to death.
