ARCTIC WEATHER.

Several Shipwrecks in Baltic and North Sea.

The recent heavy gale in the Baltic and North Sea has caused several shipwrecks. The big Swedish Lloyd Company's steamer Campania, 1,554 tons, has been aground on a reef off Stockholm since Tuesday. Other steamers have sunk, but the crews were saved, except a ship's cook on a Swedish schooner, who was frozen to death.

FIRE ON FORMER GERMAN SHIP.

The steamer, Prinz Hubertus, formerly German owned, and now sailing under the P and O flag, took fire at the Royal Albert docks last night, and was still burning this morning. It is doubtful whether any of the cargo can be saved. The vessel is seriously damaged.

DEATH OF MISS L. VEREKER

We regret to record the death of Miss Leila Vereker, youngest daughter of the late Mr Henry Vereker. Deceased lady, who belonged to an old Limerick family, had been but a short time ill, and the news of her demise, which occurred in Dublin yesterday, will occasion sincere regret amongst a wide circle of friends in Limerick and elsewhere. Funeral from Limerick terminus at 2 o'clock on Monday for the Vereker burial place at old Cahirnarry churchyard.

THE KNOCKLONG MURDER CHARGE.

Mr G McElroy, R.M., again attended at the County Limerick Prison to-day and further remanded, on the application of Mr J S Gaffney, Crown Solicitor, for eight days. Michael Sharahan, Edmond Foley, Patrick Maher, and Michael Murphy. The prisoners are charged with the murder of Sergeant Peter Wallace, R.I.C., and Constable Michael Enright, R.I.C. at Knocklong railway station on the evening of the 13th May last.

RAID IN CLARE.

Struggle at Mount Callan House

Our Ennis correspondent wires:—Mount Callan House was raided last night by an armed party. Colonel Tottenham, D.L., came into the hall to meet the raiders, and resisted their demand for arms. A struggle took place, during which he was knocked down and his eyes blackened. He also received a cut on the head from a club or stick. The party then ransacked the house, taking away two shot guns, one rifle, a miniature rifle, and two revolvers, and a quantity of ammunition. The raiders remained on the premises from 8 o'clock till 9.30. No arrests have been made. The Colonel has been visited by a doctor.
