

MERICK SPRING ASSIZES.

Appeal Court.

(Continued from Fourth Page.)

(Before Lord Justice O'Connor.)

TITLE ACTIONS.

Hayes was defendant in an appeal by John Hill and Daniel O'Connell, who were decreed title in a sum of 2s 6d, being damages for loss on her lands at Drombanny.

Kelly (instructed by Messrs W Leahy and Co) was for the respondent, and Mr L O'B (instructed by Mr H O'B Moran) for the appellants.

Decision of the court below was affirmed. Daniel Quigley and Anne Quigley were appellants, and a decree for 2s 6d on a title action was granted by Anne Hayes for trespass on her lands at Drombanny.

Appearances were the same, and evidence was tendered, his lordship affirmed the decision.

OVERHOLDING.

Application for overholding was brought in County Court by Bridget Thornhill, against James H Madden in respect of part of the lands of Mallock, containing 3a 2r 20p, statute acre, with dwellinghouse and out-offices. The County Court Judge gave a decree for possession, and the defendant appealed against the decision. Counsel having been given, the judgment of the County Court Judge was affirmed.

H D Connor, K.C., and Mr M Binchy (instructed by Messrs J Binchy and Sons) represented the plaintiff; Mr P Lynch, K.C., and Mr P (instructed by Mr J J Power) the defendants.

POSSESSION CASE.

James P O'Brien and Delia O'Brien appealed against a decision of the County Court Judge dismissing an action brought by Lucy Bolton for possession of a dwellinghouse, No 4 Munster Terrace, Limerick.

It was stated that the tenancy was a quarterly tenancy and was determined on the 15th September. His lordship reversed the dismissal, with a stay of six months.

ACTION AGAINST RAILWAY CO.

The respondent, John Casey, Roche's street, Limerick, was plaintiff in a suit against the appellants, the Great Western Railway Company, who were decreed for £2 11s 8d damages for negligence in the carriage of eggs consigned to him in January, 1919.

M Binchy (instructed by Messrs R Amara and Co) was for the respondent, and Mr J Phelps (instructed by Messrs P S Connolly and Co), for the appellants.

His lordship reversed the decision of the County Court.

FLOODING OF LANDS.

Thomas Nunan appealed from a dismissal in an action against the Limerick County Council for damages for the flooding of his lands at Curry by constructing a foot-plate and obstructing a shore.

HOTEL AFFAIR,

Prince Joachim's Denial.

Berlin, Monday.

Prince Joachim Albrecht denies he participated in the Hotel Adlon affair, for which the Foreign Minister has tendered an apology to the French Charge D'Affaires. Two similar incidents are reported from Bremen. In the first case two French officers were roughly handled by the crowd. In the other case two French and one Italian officer were considerably injured by the crowd, but the police rescued them.

Mr Comyn said the action was brought before a jury of the city, and was dismissed on the merits. The jury found that Mullane was struck by a policeman, but not by Constable Horan. The defence put up in the Court below was that Horan was not outside William street police station at the hour that the plaintiff was assaulted. On the
