DEATH OF MR J G QUAID, C.P.S.

We regret extremely to record the death of Mr George J Quaid, Clerk of Petty Sessions, Dromcollogher, which took place at St John's Hospital, Limerick, on Tuesday evening, after a short illness. The sad news has been received with genuine sorrow throughout the city and county of Limerick, and many other parts of the country, as well, where the deceased gentleman was so well and popularly known. He was a son of the late Mr George Quaid, Ballykennedy, Ballingarry, a highly respected county family, and his genial and kindly disposition made him a great favourite, while the ability with which he filled the position of Petty Sessions Clerk at Dromcollogher was ever recognised by the magistrates and the public. His demise in the prime of life is, as said, deeply mourned by a wide circle of friends, and there is widespread sympathy with his bereaved relatives, including his brother, Mr John J Quaid, J.P., the popular and efficient Secretary of the Limerick Co Council. The remains were removed to Rathkeale Parochial Church on Wednesday, and the funeral, which was very large and representative, took place to-day for C.ouncagh.
