## LIMERICK UNION.

### MILK SUPPLY REQUIRED.

**T**HE Guardians of this Union will, at their meeting on **WEDNESDAY, 21st APRIL, 1920**, receive tenders for supplying the Workhouse from the 1st May, 1920, to 1st May, 1921, with from 200 to 250 Gallons Pure New Milk daily, at per gallon. The Milk must produce not less than the standard of nine degrees of cream each delivery, and when such shall not have been reached a penalty of 2d. per degree per gallon will be imposed on each gallon delivered. Milk must be delivered at the Workhouse Stores at such hours in the morning as the Master may require, and any contractor failing to deliver at the hours specified by the Master will be subject to a fine of 10s. for every such failure, and any contractor not supplying up to half the quantity contracted for will be fined one shilling per gallon on the shortage. If found practicable the quantity for which each contractor tenders will be received in the morning in one delivery. If the tender of one single contractor is the lowest the whole of his milk may be taken daily and in one delivery (if found practicable). Parties tendering must lodge in the Clerk's Office the sum of £2, which shall be forfeited to the Guardians unless a bond for due fulfilment of contract is signed within ten days of the acceptance thereof. Sealed tenders, containing the names of two solvent sureties for the due performance of the contract, to be sent through the post, addressed to the Presiding Chairman, so as to reach the Workhouse before 12 noon on the above named day, marked on the outside "Pure New Milk." The lowest or any tendered not be accepted.—By order.
