this necessitated a rise in the price of not less than
30 per cent. When the second half of the bread
subsidy comes to be withdrawn, then, other things
being equal, a second and similar rise in the price
will have to be anticipated.

IRISH SPIRIT TRADE PRICES.

By arrangement with the Ministry of Food, the
several sections of the Spirit Trade in Ireland
have agreed to a scale of inter-trade prices which
will enable the Retail Branch of the Trade on and
after the 1st proximo to sell whiskey at the
following prices:—Rate per glass, 1s 8d, 10 glass
bottle, 16s. The whiskey so sold shall be of a
strength not weaker than 25 degrees under
proof as prescribed by the Food and Drugs Act.
These prices represent the equivalent of the prices
chargeable in Great Britain, making allowance for
the higher strength at which whiskey is sold in
Ireland. The arrangement is sanctioned on the
understanding that defaulters shall be penalised
by the withholding of further supplies of whiskey
by the Distilling and Wholesale Branches of the
Trade.

THE SHANNON BOATING TRAGEDY.

Second Body Recovered.

The body of the young lad Albert O'Driacoll,
who lost his life by the capsizing of a boat in the
Shannon at Doonass on Whit-Monday, was found
yesterday by some boys who were fishing at
Castle Troy. They had the remains removed to
the shore in a boat, and telephoned for the Cor-
poration ambulance, which took them to the
mortuary at Barrington's Hospital some time later
in the day. Last night at nine o'clock the remains
were taken to St Michael's Church, and this
evening, at three o'clock, the funeral took place
for Mount St Lawrence Cemetery. The cortege
was of large proportions, and testified to the
respect entertained for the deceased and the
sympathy felt for his parents and relatives in the
tragic circumstances under which a promising
youth met his death.
