### DEATH OF MR WM H M BENNETT. J.P.

The death occurred on Sunday at his residence, Glenefy, Galbally, County Limerick, of Mr Wm H Massy Bennett, J.P. The deceased, who was aged about 70, came of an old County Limerick family.
