SS. "GLENSTAL."

The Limerick Steamship Company's new steamer "Glenstal", 5,100 tons deadweight, is expected to arrive in the port of Limerick, on Sunday morning next. This vessel loaded a cargo of timber in the St Lawrence for Cork, and the balance for Messrs. Spaight, Limerick. She was signalled by passing the Old Head of Kinsale, at ten o'clock this morning. She is the second largest steamer owned by the Limerick Steamship Co., the largest being the st. "Knockfierna", 8,400 tons deadweight, which vessel is plying between Africa and North America, and is the largest Irish owned steamer running.

DEATH OF MR PETER HAMILTON.

We regret extremely to record the death of Mr Peter James Hamilton, of Oldfield, Limerick, and Secretary of the firm of Messrs. Matterson and Sons, Ltd. which took place last night at Llanidrod, Wells, after a brief illness. Not feeling well he left town some three weeks ago for rest and change, and it was hoped that this would very soon recuperate his health. The news, therefore, of his demise, which was received in the city this morning, was learned with deep regret by a wide circle of friends, who highly esteemed him for his excellent qualities as a business man and as a private citizen. He was for some thirty-seven years connected with the firm of Messrs. Matterson, where he was held in the highest regard by the principals and the staff. For thirty years or more he was Hon. Treasurer of the Limerick Protestant Young Men's Association. He took the keenest interest in the welfare of the Institution, and its members, the younger members especially, who ever valued to the full his keen judgment, sound advice, and broad-minded views. His premature demise is deeply regretted by all who knew him, and they sincerely sympathise with his widow and family and other relatives in the bereavement that has so unexpectedly come to them.
