communiqué was issued in Warsaw on Thursday evening:—We have taken Kolno, Lomza, and Ostrolenka. In the sector of Rodzanow and Raclaz we are clearing the country of the remaining Bolshevik bands.

During the recent fighting at Bialystok we took 10,000 prisoners, 40 guns, and 60 machine guns. Our operations towards Osowice are developing. East of Cholm, on the Bug, and east of Lemberg, the Poles have had local successes.

A telegram from Berlin yesterday states:—A Koenigsberg telegram of Wednesday's date says:—The Poles yesterday occupied Szezuczyna. Their advanced troops to-day reached Proskten. The remnants of the Fourth Bolshevik Army were captured west of the Mlawa-Modlin line. The Poles have reached a line running through Knyschin, Stawiski, and Kolno, thus surrounding the Fourth and Fifteenth Bolshevik Armies. The Russian counter-attack was unsuccessful. After the capture of Bialystok by the Poles, embittered street fighting took place, in which the Poles came off the victors. Dejected Bolshevik units are crossing the frontier.

AMERICAN PRESIDENTIAL ELECTION.

A New York telegram, states:—The greatest interest has been aroused in consequence of the sweeping charges made by Governor Cox that the Republicans had raised fifteen million dollars for a campaign fund in connection with the Presidential election. Speaking to-day at Princetown, Indiana, the Democratic candidate renewed his attack, alleging that fabulous sums of money were being contributed to the Republican cause by selfish, greedy interests in order to buy the election. He added that it would be his chief aim to expose the Senatorial plot and to reveal the interests which were taking part in it.

DEATH OF MR THOMAS L. DOWEY.

We regret to record the death, at Hastings, on 16th inst of Mr Thomas L. Dowe, who was Postmaster of Limerick some years ago. The news of his demise will be heard with very deep regret by those who knew the kindly and genial disposition of the deceased. He was popular both with the Post Office staff here and with the citizens in general, who appreciated his unvarying courtesy and his many other good qualities. Mr Dowe had reached the ripe age of 74. To his family and friends we tender our sympathy in their sorrow.

IRISH FISH SOLD AT HALF PRICE.

Curious anomalies are revealed in returns of the quantity of fish landed in Ireland in the first quarter of this year. While the catch was 107,000 cwts, against 63,000 in the corresponding period last year, the value to the fishermen was only £104,000, actually less than last year—£109,000.
