

## LAND IN THE COMMONS.

Central News Lobby Correspondent writing to the resumption of Parliament this says:—The new factor in the Irish case is not so much the antagonism between the Minister and the member for Paisley, as the recent pronouncements of Viscount Grey, the subject show a marked divergence of view between him and Mr Asquith on the subject of giving Ireland control of her military arrangements. This divergence of view was vigorously canvassed in Coalition. The Irish question will take first place in the discussion of the House of Commons when it meets; and I am informed that both the Government and the Independent Liberal Party will take the earliest opportunity of asking for an adjournment motion, which may indeed develop into a direct vote of censure to discuss the Government's Home Rule Bill, which is undoubtedly intended to proceed with, will be introduced immediately after the Commons meets.
