COST OF FOODSTUFFS GOING DOWN.

SUGAR PRICE REDUCTION.

The Food Ministry announces the retail price of sugar will be reduced as from Monday next by a penny per lb following on the reduction of 8s per cwt in the wholesale price, which took place Tuesday last.

The Wheat Commission announces a further reduction of a shilling per sack in the price of flour which, with the two previous reductions, is equal to 2d off the 4lb loaf.

IMPROVEMENT OF ROADS.

Of the £8,000,000 which, it is estimated, will be realised from the new motor tax, between £6,000,000 and £7,000,000 will be definitely allotted to the improvement of roads, says a "Daily Chronicle" representative. A large number of local authorities are taking advantage of the Government offer of 50 p.c. of the cost of arterial road construction, and it is significant that the Ministry of Transport is insisting that at least 70 p.c. of the money expended shall be in wages.
