# Kerry Civilian Shot.

The following was published yesterday: -OFFICIAL NOTICE.

Cornelius Murphy, of Ballydaly, Rathmore, Co Kerry, farmer, was tried at Cork on 17th January. 1921, by a military court for offences against martial law.

He was charged with being, at Bullydaly aforesaid, on 4th January, 1921, in improper possession of arms and ammunition, Lamely, a loaded revolver.

The Court found Cornelius Murphy guilty. and sentenced him to suffer death by being shot.

The finding and sentence of the court were duly confirmed by the General Officer, Commanding-in-Chief in Ireland.

The sentence was duly executed at 08.01 hours

on lst February, 1921.
