# GERMANY'S INDEMNITY.

French Explanation of the Proposed 12 p.c. Tax.

Paris, Sunday .- It has hitherto been believed mistakenly in many quarters that the 12 per cent of the total of Germany's exports to be paid to the Allies in addition to the fixed annuity was meant to be in the nature of an export tax, and this idea has been encouraged by a rumber of the German commercial houses, who have issued circulars to their clients abroad referring to it as a reason for the rise in their prices. The "Daily News," immediately upon the break up of the Paris conterence, drew attention to the error, and called for an explicit and authoritative statement. M L ncheur, Minister for the devastated regions, has now made the matter clear. "It was never." he said, " a question of making Germany impose a tax upon her exports. It is simply a method of calculation to arrive at the amount of the variable annuity, which is to depend on the economic development of the country, and any other inter-pretation is wrong."-" Daily News" correspondent.
