**THE TELEPHONE SERVICE.**

A London Correspondent writes:—As the re-  
 sult of the debate on the proposed new telephone

 a committee shall be appointed who shall do its  
 work thoroughly and not allow itself to be spoon-  
 fed with information. The least that can be said  
 is this—we cannot afford to have a dear and in-  
 efficient service, and that is what Mr Illingworth
