Mr John Cathcart, managing director, Pasley and Co, Ltd, was shot dead in his house at P. arce's Square, Youghal, yesterday morning by armed raiders, who entered forcibly at the back. An envelope, inscribed: "Convicted spy—Spies and informers beware—I R.A." was found near the body.

Mr Cathcart was a most successful, unassuming and courteous business man, who took no part in political matters.

This crime, perpetrated on Good Friday, has shocked the whole community. Much police activity prevailed since the occurrence.

Mr Cathcart leaves three motherless children and an aged mother.
