## FUNERAL OF TEMPORARY CADET PRINGLE.

The remains of the late Temporary Cadet Pringle, who lost his life in the Castleconnell shooting on Sunday evening, were removed from the Military Barracks yesterday afternoon for interment at the King's Island cemetery. Full military honours were accorded the deceased, and as the cortege passed through the streets due respect was paid by the citizens, and a military band played the funeral march. The cortege was composed of a large party of auxiliaries, police, and military. The coffin was covered with the Union Jack and floral wreaths. The Very Rev. Dean Hackett and Rev. A. E. Hewatson officiated at the cemetery. The deceased cadet was, we learn, a native of Devonshire.

## RAID ON RAILWAY SIGNAL BOXES.

At 12 o'clock last night masked and armed men entered the signal boxes at Sixmile-Bridge and Longpavement railway stations and took away the telephone apparatus. The signal men in both stations were held up during the operation, which only lasted half an hour. ## EX-SOLDIER SHOT DEAD

The following was issued from the Police on Thursday afternoon:—"John Kelly, an ex-soldier, of Newmarket-on-Fergus, was taken from his house by a party of men at 11.30 last night and shot dead at Ballycar, two miles from his home. A Press Association telegram says:—"In connection with the shooting of Kelly, an ex-soldier, of Newmarket-on-Fergus, it is officially stated that six armed men gained admittance to his house at Ballycar, and that they were police. Kelly was shot in the presence of a priest, who had been called to administer the last rites. At the scene of the shooting, a body, which was found lying at a distance from his house, was the body of an ex-soldier, who was shot last night. Beware."
