POLICE LORRY FIRED ON.

Limerick Ex-Soldier Killed.

A party of police travelling by lorry from the
Limerick Junction to Limerick on Sunday were
fired on from the railway bridge at Singland, about
a mile from the city. The police returned the
fire, and in the course of the interchange a civilian
named Henry Clancy, a labourer, and stated to be
an ex-soldier, was fatally wounded and died some
short time afterwards. Thomas Keane, a
carpenter, was taken into custody and conveyed
to William-street Barracks.

OFFICIAL REPORT.

A Dub'in official report says:—A party
of K.I.C from Limerick were out on patrol in
lorries at four o'clock yesterday afternoon, when
they encountered a party of armed men concealed
at Singland Railway Bridge, about two miles
from Limerick City. It was stated that on the
approach of the police the rebels fled after opening
fire. The police replied and gave chase. In a
running battle which ensued one of the rebels was
shot dead and one captured. A loaded revolver
was found on each. There were no casualties to
